

TRASH DUMPSTERS

At the annual meeting, in December it was discussed that the HOA will no longer be doing the dumpster. There has been a lot of abuse of the dumpsters and not necessarily by the residents of Jackson Creek Filing #5. The dumpsters were overfilled, items that could have been recycled were placed in them, and items that are not allowed to be thrown away were disposed of in the dumpster. Steve, a board member, talked about the free dumpster with the Town of Monument. The Town of Monument Public Works Department operates a 30 yard dumpster out of the Public Works Yard located off North Jefferson Street. This is open to Monument residents. You will be required to verify your residence in order to use the dumpster. To schedule a drop off, please contact the Parks and Street Superintendent at 719-481-2436.

If you're tossing everyday waste, chances are they will take it. The Town of Monument follows the El Paso County rules for what can be placed into a dumpster. Please visit El Paso County website for a of list hazardous waste items that can not be accepted.

SPRING CLEAN UP LIST


We all want our properties to feel like home, don't we? You know the feeling, it hits you as soon as you see your front door. A big contributor to that homey feeling is maintaining good curb appeal. It helps more than your home, too. Curb appeal helps keep our neighborhood looking inviting and it is an important way to improve your home's appreciation in value. Show pride in your home and make it sparkle this spring! Here's a simple checklist to keep your home and neighborhood actually feeling like home:

- Inspect your siding and add a new coat of paint to protect your siding from permanent damage.
- Start interviewing contractors in April for painting and landscaping projects
- Submit all requests to the ARC for painting and outdoor projects in advance of commencing with your project **ARC has up to 30 days to give approval.
- Schedule a spring aeration for your lawn.
- Prune overgrown trees and shrubs to give a more manicured appearance to your yard.
- Check your pine trees for beetle infestation. Lodgepole, Ponderosa and Austrian Pines are susceptible to this infestation.
- Spray Ash trees for ash borer, including the new strain that has now invaded our area.
- Check your short needle pine trees for the tussock moth. See next page article.
- Keep your lawn mowed weekly and clean up your grass clippings.
- Rake up pine needles to prevent damage to your turf.
- Regularly check and cleanup your landscaping for weeds, especially those pesky dandelions.



Tussock Moth Control

Tussock moth control is an important component of any property owner in Colorado. The Douglas Fir tussock moth is a common pest in Colorado. The Tussock moth caterpillar (*Orgyia psuedotsugata*) eat the needles of spruce, Douglas fir, and true fir trees. These caterpillars cause defoliation, which occurs rapidly from the top of the tree down. Tree tops can often be completely destroyed after a single season. If trees are subjected to multiple attacks, they can be killed or severely weakened and subject to attack by other pests, including <u>bark beetles</u>. If you see a Tussock Moth on your trees you should call an arborist as soon as possible.
