Recipe

PB & J French Toast—Contributed by Amy Numedahl

- 1/2 cup peanut butter
- 1 cup sugar
- 6 large eggs
- 1 3/4 cup heavy cream
- 2 teaspoons vanilla bean paste or vanilla extract
- 8 cups torn bread cubes
- 1 cup good quality strawberry jam (not jelly)
- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
- 1/2 cup chopped roasted and salted peanuts

Make it now:

- 1. Coat the inside of a 9x13 baking dish with nonstick cooking spray (or 2, 8x8 square)
- 2. In an electric mixer bowl, cream together the peanut butter and sugar at low speed. Add the eggs, one at a time, incorporating after each addition. Slowly pour in the cream, beating until the mixture is blended. It may appear curdled, but that is okay. Add the vanilla bean paste and mix to incorporate.
- 3. Place the bread cubes in a large bowl. Pour the peanut butter mixture over the bread cubes and stir until all the cubes are coated.
- 4. Transfer half of the bread mixture to the prepared pan(s). Dot the top with the strawberry jam, and then spread the jam with a spatula to within about 1/2 inch of the sides of the pan. Spread the remaining bread mixture over the jam, drizzle with the melted butter and sprinkle with the peanuts. Cover the baking dish and refrigerate for up to 2 days or freeze for up to 1 month.

Bake it later:

- 1. Defrost the casserole overnight in the refrigerator, if necessary.
- 2. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Let the casserole come to room temperature for about 30 minutes
- 3. Bake the casserole for 35-40 minutes, or until the top is golden brown and the casserole is bubbling. Serve warm.
